

ADDITIONAL ACTIVITIES TO KEEP THE FUN GOING!

CRAFT IDEAS:

Travel Pack:

Supplies Needed: Stick from yard, bandana, string/ribbon

Instructions: Just tie bandana to stick to make a fun carry pack. Kids can put their favorite treasure in it or go for a nature scavenger hunt and fill it up and share your treasures.



Handprint Campfire:

Supplies Needed: paper; orange, red & brown paint, cotton balls, stick, glue.

Straw Fish:

Supplies Needed: Fun paper, googly eyes, stickers, straws, string/ribbon

Instructions: Cut paper in fish shape head and tail, decorate w/eyes & stickers. Cut straws in all sorts of sizes to make body of the fish. In the center of each straw poke a hole. Now thread straws like you are beading a necklace tape the back of both ends of ribbon/string.



Glow Stick Lantern:

As a reminder to let your LIGHT SHINE BRIGHT!

Supplies Needed: water bottle & a glow stick

Campsite Keepsake Idea: Explore your yard/neighborhood/walking trails/park together collecting supplies to create a keepsake from your Family Camp-IN 2020!

Supplies Needed: Dark Piece of construction paper, treasure from outside: small twigs, greenery from trees, tissue paper, dried flowers/weeds, glue; white pen to write with.

Instructions: Glue your finds to create a one of a kind camping pictures.

GAME IDEAS:

1. Camping Mad Lib, I Spy, Word Search, & Scavenger Hunt (Legacy provided)

2. Fish/Loaves Relay:

Supplies Needed: 2 plastic bins/trash cans filled with crumpled up paper (junk mail is good for crumpled paper); Cut out fish and loaves out of construction paper. Cut out enough for everyone to get a couple.

Instructions: Hide Fish/Loaves in bins. Have 2 teams. Run to the tub, get a fish/loaf and run back. First team to find all of them wins.



3. Ordinary to Extraordinary Things Hunt:


Instructions: Go on a Hunt for Ordinary Things (i.e. spoon, toothbrush, etc.)

- Everyone should come back with something different. If 2 are alike, find something else. Trade objects and come up with 2 or more ways you can use that item in a way that's different from what it's normally used for. *(For example, a spoon can help build a sandcastle, a toothbrush can scratch your back.)*
- *There are no wrong answers, let them be creative!*
- **ADULT SAY:** God often uses ordinary people and things to do BIG miracles. God can use your ordinary things to do something amazing too!

4. Lunch Bag Story Re-telling:

Supplies Needed: A brown paper bag/lunch sack; string; construction paper; scissors; tape

Instructions: Prep ahead or do together as a family. Cut out fish and loaves. Tape to a long string. Put the string inside paper bag. One by one go around circle and retell little bits of the Bible story as you pull out a fish/loaf each time. The kids do not know how long the string is, so whoever the end lands on WINS!



APPLICATION IDEAS:

- Bake something together & share it with a neighbor
- Do yard work for a neighbor or an elderly person
- Send a Door Dash dinner to a neighbor or someone you want to share Jesus with!
- Pick up trash in your neighborhood/park
- Pick up your room/house without your parents having to ask you.
- Write a kind note to a friend/grandparent/neighbor and put it in the mail
- Leave a surprise on a front porch of someone who needs Jesus
- Put together a basket to share with someone who needs to know "For nothing is impossible with God" Luke 1:37

DINNER IDEAS:

- Hobo Dinner: Meat, seasoning, veggies in foil packets over the grill
- Roast Hot Dogs on a stick over campfire
